- Students correct their work and resubmit.






Save time with PeerMark


- Student submissions

 - free response and scale questions.






PeerMark free response and scale questions



Why Introduced?

1. Scholarly Issues

- Develop academic writing skills.
- Develop referencing skills.

2. Plagiarism

- Double counting.
- Significant increase in accessible online resources.



My experience is Turnitin is ...

- not necessarily time saving at the point of marking BUT counting administration – yes
- GREAT developmental tool for student's academic writing
- facilitates a consistency in marking and feedback process





What I love about Turnitin is ...

- The functionality is impressive
 - QuickMark
 - Audio comments
 - Overall comments
 - Non originality
 - Space for internal moderation





What you need to watch out for is

. . .

- Make sure you get your settings right
 - Allow multiple submissions
 - Make sure your feedback release parameters are correct.
- % Non originality ≠ Plagiarism
- Really important to close off your Turnitin assessments correctly
- Doesn't work with group assessments

31 responses from 150 students.





I found Turnitin Easy to Use

Positive Feedback from Students

 I felt this was a great way to ensure the work you have done is entirely your own, this also gave me a confidence boost as i didnt have to correct any of my assessment leaving me feeling ecstatic.





 Think its a really good tool and quite reassuring that you aren't accidentally plagerising. I have found a student version called writecheck that lets students do this themselves (for a small fee) and plan to use it on my next assignment if its not inplace for my next module





 The only reason I answered disagree for question 2 was because I didn't recieve a high percentage in my assessment, if I had then I would have modified it and would have answered agree. All in all I think Turnitin is a really great idea!





 Being able to resubmit work multiple times leading up to the deadline changing the assignment when needed using the originality score would be helpful for all modules

 I found Turnitin slightly ambiguous as there is a vast ammount of information about subjects where often facts are repeated, just because you are repeating a fact does not mean that you are plagerising work, there are many ways to express facts but is impossible to completely avoid repeating what someone else may have written



Tutor Problems

- Returning Work with Comments
 - Had to email each student individually (200 on module)
- Identifying the student ID number on downloaded assignments can be a challenge
- Enormous variation in interpreting the report Tutors, MLs, and PLs all have different standards and views.
